Communal Right of Mutual Forgiveness

Explanation: Our Christian faith has been preserved through the ages in 2 ways: Scripture (written) and Tradition (verbal). Since parts of the second one are sometimes forgotten, the Church now is trying to bring them back into practice. One such practice of our Christian tradition is the Order of "Fraternal Reconciliation", a beautiful and meaningful practice of the ancient church community. Nowadays, it is mostly preserved in the monasteries and is being brought back by many of our parishes. After the Liturgy you are invited to participate in this Order.

When the disciples of the Lord asked him to teach them how to pray (Luke 11:1-13), He left us with what we refer to as the Lord's Pray – the "Our Father". In this prayer we pray as a community or family, we do not say "My Father who is in Heaven..." we pray: "Our Father..." We ask God to forgive us our trespasses as we forgive those who trespass against us.

Before beginning our Great Lent Journey, together as a parish community or family, it is important for us to express our desire to seek forgivness for anything that we may have done; that may have hurt or offended another in the past year or during our lifetime. It is also important to extend our forgiveness to others so that we can be free of these heavy burdens, and walk together as a family and as true sons and daughters of God!

This Communal Right of Mutual Forgiveness is not the Mystery/Sacrament of Reconciliation (Confession) nor does it replace that Mystery/Sacrament, but rather is a tangible sign to each other of our willingness to forgive. It is a moment during which we can experience being forgiven as well as extending forgiveness. Hence there is no need to name our offenses, but rather with total sincerity in our hearts we us say to each other: "Forgive me my brother/sister" and answer with sincerity and love, "May God have mercy on you and know that I forgive you."

PRAYER FOR A VIBRANT PARISH - O God, Creator of Heaven and Earth! Because of your indescribable love for us, you sent your Only-Begotten Son, Our Lord and Saviour, Jesus Christ - The Way, The Truth, and The Life - and our Salvation. In His name, we turn to You. Strengthen our hearts and minds in Christian love and in unity of purpose as we strive to build a Vibrant Parish. Give us the grace to model our lives according to the Word of God. Instill in us the desire to pray and to celebrate the Holy Mysteries as one Christian Family in our Parish Community. Inspire us to follow Your great command to be a servant to the less fortunate among us! Grant this, O Lord, through the mercies and love for mankind of Your Only-Begotten Son with whom You are blessed, together with Your All-Holy, Good and Live-Giving Spirit, now and for ever and ever. Amen!

Church Etiquette: Just a reminder that to have attended the entire Divine Liturgy one must be in Church and have heard the reading of the Gospel as well as the homily, participated in the responses for the consecration and received the final Blessing before leaving the church. We also ask that you do not visit in the main part of the Church (the Nave) before during or after the Service. Please use the Vestibule or the Fellowship room to conduct your conversations leave the Church proper for those that want to pray.

ANNOUNCEMENT

"What good is fasting from food if we do not fast from sins? What good is it to be careful not to eat meat on Fridays and maybe even on Wednesdays and yet be unconcerned about the violence we are doing to the poor and misunderstood? What gain have we if we avoid wine but still become drunk with material pleasures or pleasures of the flesh?" St. John Chrysostom

The Sunday of Forgiveness is also known as Cheese-fare Sunday. This was the last day that dairy products would be consumed before the Holy Day of Resurrection. The Great Lenten or Fast begins the following day, Monday. On Sunday evening we begin to add to our daily Prayer – the Prayer of Forgiveness or the prayer of St. Ephrem accompanied by prostrations. This prayer directs us further on the path of repentance and helps us to acknowledge our sin(s) and our need for forgiveness from God and as well from our brothers and sisters in Christ.

What is Lent? Lent is the forty-day liturgical season of special prayer, fasting, and almsgiving in preparation for Easter. The name "Lent" is from the Middle English and Anglo-Saxon language meaning spring; its more primitive ecclesiastical name was "forty days," *tessaracoste* in Greek. The number "forty" is first noted in the Canons of Nicaea (A.D. 325), following Jesus' fast in the desert before His public ministry (with Old Testament precedent in Moses and Elijah). By the tenth century, most faithful practiced a six day fast for six weeks (Sundays were excluded) and concluded on or before the days of the Passion of Christ.

Families can make Lenten memories:

Great Lent offers opportunities to pass on and share your faith with your children. Here are some ideas for making Lenten memories:

- Pray together. Even if it is just an Our Father or Hail Mary it unites the family.
- Let each family member mention one person or problem that they would like to pray for in a special way at dinnertime.
- Take the children grocery shopping for the poor. Let them help you bring the food to your parish collection box or the local food bank.
- Let children light a candle at church for people throughout the world who are sick or hungry.
- Sample Lenten food favourites, such as hot cross buns or pretzels. If you are really adventurous, check the Internet for recipes and make your own!

<u>Lenten fast and abstinence</u>: *No dairy products or meat* are consumed on the *First day of Great Lent and Good Friday*. This applies to all Catholics 14 and older and younger than 60 years of age.

Days of abstinence: refers to all Fridays during the year except when it follows a major Feast day when the Ukrainian Catholic abstains from eating meat.

Days of Fast: are when the penitent consumes one full meal such as on *First day of Great Lent and Good Friday.* Two smaller meals are permitted, but the smaller meals should not equal a second full meal. Coffee, tea and water do not affect the fast. Snacks between meals are not allowed. This applies to all Catholics 14 and older and younger than 60 years of age.

What almsgiving *really* means: Giving is an important part of Great Lent. Most often it will mean giving money to Catholic charities or other good causes.

But the concept of almsgiving goes much deeper. It is our response to the teachings of Jesus that encourage us to help people in need—not just with money—but our time and our talents. Today we might call it 'stewardship.'

During Great Lent we are to cultivate a spirit of generosity, sharing what we have with the less fortunate – strengthening all the members of the Body of Christ. "It is more blessed to give than to receive" (Acts 20:35)

Bless me, Father, for I have sinned... If you have not gone to confession in a while, as Great Lent begins, this is the perfect time to reconcile yourself with God and the Church.

Preparation for confession should include an examination of conscience. This means you recall the sins you have committed since your last confession.

Most people begin their confession with: "Bless me, Father, for I have sinned. It has been (state the number of days, months or years) since my last confession."

If you cannot remember the words or you do not recall how long it has been,

do not worry. Just tell the priest it has been a long time, and he will guide you through the process.

What you will experience is the healing gift of God's love, the chance to start over with a clean conscience, and an overwhelming sense of gratitude.

Pretzels: A Lenten treat:

Pretzels originated in Europe during the Middle Ages. A monk was making unleavened bread for Lent with flour and water because eggs, milk and lard were not consumed as part of the Lenten fast. He twisted some of the dough into the shape of people praying with both arms folded across their chests. He decided it would be a perfect treat for children learning to say their prayers. He called the treats pretiola, the Latin word for "little reward."

10 tips for making the season more meaningful:

- 1. **Slow Down** Set aside at least 10 minutes a day for silent prayer or meditation. It will revitalize your body and your spirit.
- 2. **Read a good Christian book** You could choose the life of a saint, a spiritual how-to, an inspirational book or one of the pope's new books.
- 3. Be kind Go out of your way to do something nice for someone every day.
- 4. **Get involved** Attend a Lenten lecture or spiritual program.
- 5. **Volunteer at your parish** Whether it is the parish fish fry, cleaning the church or helping with some activity within the Parish, it will give you a chance to help others.
- 6. **Reach out** Invite an inactive Catholic to come with you to church or even to receive the Mysteries (Sacraments) in our church.
- 7. Pray Especially for people you do not like and for people who do not like you.
- 8. **Tune out** Turn off the television and spend quality time talking with family members or friends.
- 9. Clean out closets Donate gently used items to the St. Vincent de Paul Society.
- 10. **Donate** Then pick one mission and decide how you can help by sending money, clothing or supplies.

A Different Kind of Prayer

Heavenly Father, help us remember that the jerk who cut us off in traffic last night is a single mother who worked nine hours that day and is rushing home to cook dinner, help with homework, do the laundry and spend a few precious moments with her children.

Help us to remember that the pierced, tattooed, disinterested young man who can not make change correctly is a worried 19-year-old college student, balancing his apprehension over final exams with his fear of not getting his student loans for next semester.

Remind us, Lord, that the scary looking bum, begging for money in the same spot every day (who really ought to get a job!) is a slave to addictions that we can only imagine in our worst nightmares.

Help us to remember that the old couple walking annoyingly slow through the store aisles and blocking our shopping progress are savouring this moment, knowing that, based on the biopsy report she got back last week, this will be the last year that they go shopping together.

Heavenly Father, remind us each day that, of all the gifts you give us, the greatest gift is love. It is not enough to share that love with those we hold dear. Open our hearts not to just those who are close to us, but to all humanity. Let us be slow to judge and quick to forgive, show patience, empathy and love.

Compunction

Awareness of having sinned does not lead us to guilt or remorse, but to what the Christian Tradition calls compunction. Compunction – more often called contrition in the West – in its literal sense means a "pricking," a quick, "clean" piercing through of the heart by the awareness that one has done something wrong. It is an acute realization of our responsibility for something we have done or failed to do and of our need to confess it, ask forgiveness for it and make amends. Compunction is the voice of our conscience; it alerts us to the fact that something is "off," that we are on the wrong path, that we have sinned. It calls us not only to grieve over the selfishness and emptiness of our lives, but also to change them.

For it is essential for us to remember that the belief in God's infinite mercy and power to forgive must never be used as an excuse for not struggling with the evil that is in our hearts or lives with all the strength that we have. We cannot simply "weep" over the sins we have committed and go on living our lives "like the pagans do," as Christians have so often been, justly, accused of doing. God who sees our hearts will not be fooled. When we embrace the way of conversion we commit ourselves to strive every day to turn our lives, as well as our hearts, back to God.

On the other hand, we need to be always aware of the danger of falling into the wrong kind of guilt. We need to hold on to our conviction that we are always within the "operation of God's grace"; that God is always ready to receive us back, whenever we truly ask for his help and mercy. Our willingness to be open to the voice of our conscience and our never-ending struggle to change our lives will not lead us to despondency and self-blame, but will help us to discern what is really going on in our hearts: what needs

to be affirmed and rejoiced in, what needs to be consoled and healed, what needs to be rejected and what needs to be forgiven.

This is why repentance has been called a way of "making friends" with ourselves. When we come into the presence of God and experience the reality of his mercy and love, we can also begin to know and love ourselves as God knows and loves us. We are able to realize more clearly our failures and sins, our need for true conversion of heart; but we also learn to accept the truth of ourselves and surrender ourselves totally, just as we are – the good and the bad – into God's hands and be at peace.

Prayer of Repentance

If we can understand repentance in this way – as a way of turning away from ourselves and surrendering to God – we can also understand why we cannot do it alone. True repentance is always a sign of the presence of the Holy Spirit working in us. The Gospel tells us that Christ's call to repentance – and John the Baptist's before him – was made in the power of the Spirit. (Luke 4:14) We cannot enter or persevere on the way of repentance unless we are summoned and sustained by God. Repentance is the life of the Spirit within us, a life of truth and love. In other words, it is a life of prayer.

We repent, we walk the path of conversion, in order to return to God and live in God's presence. Repentance that is not prayer, that is not a way of entering into the presence of God, is not and never can be true repentance. It is not a way of love; it could be instead a way of guilt and self-condemnation that so many people today consider it to be.

However, the opposite is also true, I think. In a very real sense, prayer that is not repentance is not true prayer. To put it another way, every true prayer leads us to repentance. Every time we stand before the face of God, every time we approach the mystery of God's presence, how can we not repent? When we look at God and God looks at us, how can we fail to realize, with ever-greater clarity, the pain of our alienation and poverty? How can we not ceaselessly long for mercy and love? How can we help repenting?

Repentance – conversion of the heart – does not mean being filled and tormented by guilt. Rather, it is a readiness to become aware of all that goes on within our hearts and to admit our responsibility for our actions and thoughts. It means recognizing our need for forgiveness and making a firm commitment to change our lives. Above all, it means turning to God in prayer and in love, and thus opening ourselves to the work of the Spirit in us and embracing fully the gift of our salvation.

1 Corinthians - a modern "Easter" adaptation

If I decorate my house perfectly with Easter eggs, pussy willows, even an icon or two, but do not show love to my family, I am just another decorator.

If I slave away in the kitchen, baking many paskas & babkas, making butter lambs, even shop for meats & cheese and arrange a beautifully adorned Easter basket, but do not show love to my family, I am just another cook.

If I work at the soup kitchen, sing hymns galore in the nursing home and give all that I have to charity, but do not show love to my family, it profits me nothing.

If I attend a myriad of Easter gatherings and sing in the choir's cantata but do not focus on Christ, I have missed the point.

Love stops the cooking to hug the child. Love sets aside the decorating to kiss the husband. Love is kind, though harried and tired. Love does not envy another's home that has coordinated china and table linens. Love does not yell at the kids to get out of the way.

Love does not give only to those who are able to give in return but rejoices in giving to those who cannot give.

Love bears all things, believes all things, hopes all things, and endures all things. Love never fails. Rather, giving the gift of LOVE will be forever!

In Malachi 3:3 we read: "He will sit as a refiner and purifier of silver."

This verse puzzled some women in a Bible study and they wondered what this statement meant about the character and nature of God. One of the women offered to find out the process of refining silver and get back to the group at their next Bible Study.
