Romans 13:11 - 14:4 Matthew 6:14-21 **TODAY: Sunday, February 14**: **Welcome!** The Protection of the Blessed Virgin Mary Parish welcomes all parishioners, guests, friends who join us via our recorded Sunday Divine Liturgies, as we offer praise and thanksgiving to Our Lord for all blessings and graces received.

Blessed candles (Feast of Presentation) and **Holy Water** (Feast of Theophany) are available at the Parish Office.

The first day of Lent is Monday, February 15. This day is observed with a strict fast, consisting of abstinence from meat, eggs and dairy products. The same kind of fast is observed on Good Friday. Those not obliged to fast include infants, the aged, the hospitalized and seriously ill, as well as expectant and nursing mothers. Every Friday of the year we are obliged to fast from meat, except for when a feast day falls on that Friday.

The Great Fast: A Time to "Give Up"

Here are a few suggestions to help us focus during the time of the Great Fast:

- Give up bitterness; turn to forgiveness
- · Give up hatred; return good for evil
- Give up being negative; be positive
- Give up complaining; be grateful
- Give up pessimism; be an optimist
- · Give up harsh judgments; think kind thoughts
- Give up worry; trust in Divine Providence
- Give up discouragement; be full of hope
- Give up anger; be more patient (especially with yourself)
- Give up pettiness; be more mature
- Give up gloom; enjoy the beauty around you
- Give up jealousy; pray for trust
- Give up gossiping; control your thoughts
- Give up sin; turn to virtue

St. Paul in his letter to the Philippians writes: "Fill your minds with everything that is true, everything that is noble, everything that is good and pure, everything that we love and honour, and every thing that can be thought virtuous or worthy of praise." (Phil. 4:8)

St. Paul encourages us to fill our minds with all that is true, good and pure. He knows that this is a very difficult thing to achieve, but he also knows that we must rely on God's grace. To become a better, holier person is possible. We can't give up on ourselves. No matter how unworthy or sinful our lives may be, remember that Jesus takes away our sins. He takes away our iniquities and heals all our diseases. He purifies, cleans and leads to holiness.



Prayer of St. Ephrem

O Lord and Master of my life, keep from me the spirit of indifference and discouragement, lust for power, and idle chatter. (Prostration)

Instead, grant to me, Your servant, the spirit of wholeness of being, humble-mindedness, patience and love. (Prostration)

O Lord and King, grant me the grace to be aware of my sins and not to judge my neighbour, for You are blessed, now and for ever and ever.

Amen. (Prostration)

(Then with a simple bow the following is repeated four times)

God, be merciful to me, a sinner.

God, cleanse me of my sins and have mercy of me.

I have sinned without number, forgive me, O Lord.

Then the entire Prayer of St. Ephrem is recited without the usual prostrations.

One prostration is made at the end.

Tropars and Readings for Cheese-Fare Sunday

Resurrection Tropar, tone 4:

When the disciples of the Lord learned from the angel the glorious news of the resurrection and cast off the ancestral condemnation, they proudly told the apostles: "Death has been plundered! Christ our God is risen, granting to the world great mercy."

Glory to the Father and to the Son and to the Holy Spirit, now and for ever and ever. Amen.

Kondak of Cheese-Fare Sunday, tone 6:

O Lord, instructor of the ignorant and helper of the poor. Guide mankind towards wisdom and give him intelligence and understanding. O Lord, strengthen and enlighten my heart. O Word of God, grant that I may speak, for I will not keep my lips from crying out to you: "O Compassionate One, have mercy on me who have fallen!"

Prokimen, tone 8: Pray and give praise to the Lord our God. *verse:* In Judea God is known; His name is great in Israel.

A Reading from St. Paul's Letter to the Romans (13:11 - 14:4)

Brethren. You know that the day when we will be saved is nearer now than when we first put our faith in the Lord. Night is almost over, and day will soon appear. We must stop behaving as people do in the dark and be ready to live in the light. So behave properly, as people do in the day. Do not go to wild parties or get drunk or be vulgar or indecent. Do not quarrel or be jealous. Let the Lord Jesus Christ be as near to you as the clothes you wear. Then you will not try to satisfy your selfish desires.

Welcome all the Lord's followers, even those whose faith is weak. Do not criticize them for having beliefs that are different than yours. Some think it is all right to eat anything, while those whose faith is weak will eat only vegetables. But you should not criticize others for eating or for not eating. After all, God welcomes everyone. What right do you have to criticize someone else's servants? Only their Lord can decide if they are doing right, and the Lord will make sure that they do right.

Alleluia (3)

verse: It is good to give praise to the Lord; and to sing to Your name, O Most High.

verse: To announce Your mercy in the morning and Your truth every night.

A Reading of the Holy Gospel according to Matthew (6:14-21)

The Lord said: If you forgive others for the wrongs they do to you, your Father in heaven will forgive you. But if you do not forgive others, then your Father will not forgive your sins.

When you fast, do not put on a sad face as the hypocrites do when they go without eating. I promise you that they already have their reward. Instead, comb your hair and wash your face. Then others will not know that you are going without eating. But your Father sees what is done in private, and he will reward you.

Do not store up treasures on earth! Moths and rust can destroy them, and thieves can break in and steal them. Instead, store up your treasures in heaven, where moths and

rust cannot destroy them, and thieves cannot break in and steal them. Your heart will always be where your treasure is.

Communion Verse:

Praise the Lord from the heavens; praise Him in the highest. Alleluia. (3)
