Dear Parishioners and Friends,

According to the order of the Provincial Health Officer from June 30, 2021: "There are no capacity limits or restrictions on indoor or outdoor religious gatherings and worship services."

Thanks to the efforts and sacrifices we have all made, and the increased number of people being vaccinated, we have now reached a point where we can gather and worship in much the same way we did before the pandemic.

What does this mean for us?

- It means that we do not have to pre-register for Divine Liturgies.
- Masks in church are recommended, but not mandatory. In accordance with the Province's guidelines, masks are recommended for all people 12 and older who are not yet fully vaccinated - that is, two weeks have passed since their second vaccine dose.
- Some people will choose to continue to wear a face covering even after being fully vaccinated, and this choice must be respected.
- Physical distancing is not required during the Liturgical Services.
- Choral singing is permitted.

Our Eparchial Chancery recommends the following:

- Churches should continue to provide hand sanitizer at the church entrances.
- For the foreseeable future, Holy Communion will continue to be distributed by disposable spoons only. Clergy will continue to wear a mask when distributing Holy Communion.

Parish meetings, education programs, social gatherings, coffee after Divine Liturgy, etc. are now permitted as long as all regulations in the latest Gatherings and Events Provincial Health Order are followed: https://www2.gov.bc.ca/assets/gov/health/about-bc-s-health-care-system/office-of-the-provincial-health-officer/covid-19/covid-19-pho-order-gatherings-events.pdf

The pandemic is by no means over yet. Through these months, we have learned that many of the practices detailed in previous Provincial Directives are effective tools to prevent the spread of communicable diseases, including physical distancing, good hand hygiene, mask wearing, enhanced cleaning and sanitizing, and improved air quality and ventilation.

Although many restrictions are no longer in place, we must remain vigilant in keeping our churches safe places to gather for all members of our community.

We welcome all our parishioners and friends to join us in prayer and we look forward to seeing you soon.

World Day for Grandparents and the Elderly

Pope Francis, at his January 31, 2021 *Angelus*, announced the **institution** of a **World Day for Grandparents and the Elderly**, to be celebrated on **July 25, 2021**.

In the words of the Holy Father, "Dear brothers and sisters, the day after tomorrow, 2 February, we will celebrate the feast of the Presentation of Jesus in the Temple, when Simeon and Anna, both elderly, enlightened by the Holy Spirit, recognized Jesus as the Messiah. The Holy Spirit still stirs up thoughts and words of wisdom in the elderly today: their voice is precious because it sings the praises of God and safeguards the roots of peoples. They remind us that old age is a gift and that grandparents are the link between generations, passing on the experience of life and faith to the young. Grandparents are often forgotten and we forget this wealth of preserving roots and passing on.

"This is why, I have decided to establish World Day for Grandparents and the Elderly, which will be held throughout the Church every year on the fourth Sunday of July, close to the feast of Saints Joachim and Anne, Jesus' "grandparents". It is important for grandparents to meet their grandchildren and for grandchildren to meet their grandparents, because - as the prophet Joel says - grandparents, before their grandchildren, will dream, and have illusions [great desires], and young people, taking strength from their grandparents, will go forward and prophesy. And 2 February is indeed the feast of the encounter between grandparents and their grandchildren."

The theme of this first World Day is "I am with you always" (cf. Mt 28:20). The theme's purpose is to convey the closeness of God and the Church to the elderly and also to emphasize the intergenerational closeness between the young and the elderly.

This special day is intended to highlight the importance of providing adequate pastoral and spiritual attention to the elderly and calls on communities to manifest the closeness of the Church to them, especially in this time of pandemic.

To mark this special day, our 10:30 AM Divine Liturgy on Sunday, July 25 will be celebrated for all our grandparents and elderly. Please join us in giving thanks.
