Reflection on the Gospel of the Samaritan Woman

The Samaritan woman's encounter with Jesus by Jacob's well has much to tell us of our Christian experience:

- Jesus' dialogue compelled the woman to face herself as she is. Her honesty led her to discover more of what Jesus has to offer: living water of grace!
- After her conversation with Jesus the woman goes out to bring the good news. She felt the instinct of sharing her discovery, to share this with others. From the discovery of God within us, we are led by grace to communicate the awe and wonder of His grace to others.
- She felt God's mercy within and His gentle nudge to let go of the past. Then comes the onrush of greater power to proclaim not her story but the story of One who understands the human heart.
- The living water of grace overpowered her feeling of shame. Christ's presence was even a greater wonder before her. She was empowered to proclaim the One she was thirsting all her life: Truth and Mercy! She became a bearer of grace!

"Sir, give me this water, so that I many never be thirsty again." May each of us be open to receiving the living water of grace that the Lord offers us. We ourselves will then become the bearers of grace. This grace will have a profound effect on our lives and on the lives of those we meet.

Prayer to St. Joseph

Glorious Patriarch Saint Joseph, whose power makes the impossible possible, come to my aid in these times of anguish and difficulty. Take under your protection the serious and troubling situations that I commend to you, that they may have a happy outcome (here make your request).

My beloved father, all my trust is in you. Let it not be said that I invoked you in vain, and since you can do everything with Jesus and Mary, show me that your goodness is as great as your power. Amen.

(This prayer, from a 19th century French prayer book, has been recited by Pope Francis every day for more than 40 years.)

Hymns and Prayers from the Moleben to the Mother of God

"Let us sinners humbly and diligently have recourse to the Mother of God. Prostrate in repentance, let us cry out from the depth of our soul: O Queen, in Your compassion, come to our aid. Hasten, for we are perishing from the multitude of our sins. Do not turn away Your servants empty-handed, for we have no protection besides You."

Glory be to the Father, and to the Son, and to the Holy Spirit, now and for ever and ever. Amen.

Unworthy as we are, we shall never cease to proclaim Your power, O Mother of God. If You no longer intercede for us who will deliver us from so many misfortunes? Who will keep us free? We shall never leave You, O Queen; O blessed Lady, You always save Your servants from every calamity.

"Gracious Lady, You pray for all those who with faith take refuge in Your powerful protection. We sinners, ever in misery and affliction, have no other recourse to God than You. We are burdened by many sins, O Mother of God. We bow before You. Save Your servants from every calamity."

"O Joy of all the afflicted, Patroness of the persecuted, Sustainer of the hungry, Consolation of those in exile, Haven to the storm-tossed, Comfort to the sick, Protectress and Patroness of the weak, Staff of the aged, O Mother of God, You are most pure. Hasten to us, we pray, that Your servants may be saved."

Humbly bowing our heads and bending our knees, let us pray to the Lord. Lord, have mercy.

"Our ever-Gracious Queen, O Mother of God, our Hope, Refuge of orphans, Defence of the harbourless, Joy of the afflicted, Patroness of the harassed, You see our misery and our afflictions, help us because we are weak; lead us because we are strangers in this valley of tears, for You know our sufferings. Help us to overcome them, for we have no other helper but You. We have no other defender, no other gracious consoler but You, O Mother of God; guard and protect us forever. Amen."
