Warning

A St. Albert senior lost \$20,000 when someone phoned him claiming to be from the Canada Revenue Agency. People are getting a call from their bank telling them that they qualify for a gift or some other type of financial reward. All they have to do is provide the caller with some of their personal or banking information. All this sounds too good to be true. It is a scam to trick you to reveal your banking information to the scammers. If you receive such a phone call and want to be sure that it is not a scam, end the call and call your bank directly. Victims are also getting a call from people claiming to work for the CRA and saying that taxes are owed. The caller requests immediate payment by credit card or convinces the victims to purchase a prepaid credit card and to call back immediately with the info. The taxpayer is often threatened with court charges, jail or deportation. These types of communication are not from the CRA. When the CRA calls you, it has established procedures in place to make sure your personal information is protected.

Entering the Church

- After making the sign of the cross, the faithful make a small bow as a sign of reverence.
- After blessing yourself upon entering the temple, you should then walk up the main aisle and venerate (kiss) the icon that rests on the tetrapod. The tetrapod is what looks like a table, and it is placed in the center of the aisle. On it, you will find a cross, two candles and an icon depicting either the patron saint of the faith community or a specific feast or saint whose day it is. To venerate the icon, you bless yourself twice, kiss it, and then conclude with a final sign of the cross and simple bow. This veneration shows your love and respect for the saint(s) depicted on the icon, and it is also much like the icon as a window into the Divine reflects the love and respect with which the particular saint serves God. It is also a warm sign of greeting. Much like when you go to grandma's house and greet her with a hug and kiss, so should you greet Christ and His followers with the same respect.
- when entering a Ukrainian Catholic Church. In St.

 Mary's we have 2 candle stands where you can light a candle. The sign of lighting a candle and offering a sacrifice of light connects us to Christ, for Christ proclaims "I am the light of the world. Whoever follows me will not walk in darkness, but will have the light of life" (John 8:12). As we light our candle, we are immediately reminded that we are no longer slaves to sin, but rather that we have the light of Christ to guide and direct us in our lives.
- We then proceed to our place within the sanctuary, pray silently and await the beginning of Divine Services.
