St. Anthony of Padua is the patron saint of lost and stolen articles. According to legend, St. Anthony had a book of psalms in which he had written notes and comments. It was taken by a novice without his permission. The book was returned to him after the novice learned that St. Anthony was praying for it to be found. Shortly after his death people began praying to St. Anthony to locate lost or stolen articles.

Sunday of the Paralytic Reflections from Sunday evening Vespers

O Saviour, my Lord and my God! You desired to raise the fallen human race, You walked upon the earth as a man, healing the sick through Your tender compassion; and having come to the pool at the Sheepgate, You found the man who had been sick for thirty-eight years. By your word alone You restored him to health.

Glory be to the Father, and to the Son and to the Holy Spirit; now, and for ever and ever. Amen.

O Lord, the pool did not heal the paralytic, but Your word renewed him. His many years of sickness could not hinder Your power. Your voice held more authority over him than his infirmity. He threw away the burden of his sickness and carried the weight of his bed, a testimony to Your abundant compassion. Glory be to You.

Distracted Prayer

St. Cyprian (200-258 AD)

When we pray, beloved, we should be alert and earnest with our whole heart, intent on our prayers. Let all worldly thoughts pass away. Do not let the soul think about anything but the object of its prayer. Do not allow God's enemy to approach your heart at that time. For frequently he sneaks up on us and he calls our prayers away from God so that we have one thing on our heart and another in our voice.

The soul and mind, not the sound of the voice, should be intent on praying to the Lord. How can you be distracted and be carried away by foolish and profane thoughts when you are praying to the Lord! How can you ask God to hear you when you do not hear yourself? Do you want God to remember what you ask when you do not remember your requests? Such carelessness offends the majesty of God. You may appear watchful, but your heart is asleep. Instead, your heart should be watchful even when your eyes are closed in prayer. In the Song of Songs, the personified church says, "I sleep, yet my heart waketh." The Apostle Paul also anxiously and carefully warns us, "Continue in prayers, and watch in the same." He teaches us that those who God sees are watchful in prayer will receive what they ask from Him.



Heavenly Speech

St. Sulpitius Severus (363-420 AD)

Restrain your tongue from speaking evil. Put the bridle of the law on your mouth so that, if you speak at all, you will speak only when it would be sinful to be silent. Beware lest you say anything others can rightly find fault with. For once a word is spoken, it is as if you threw a stone. Therefore, we must think over our words for a long time before we speak them. The lips that never say what they wish they could recall are blessed. And the speech of a pure mind must also be pure. It must always edify rather than injure the hearers. The Apostle Paul commanded, "Let no corrupt communications proceed out of your mouth, but that which is good for the edification of faith, that it may convey grace to them that hear."

The tongue that does not form any words but these about Divine things is precious to God. And the mouth which flows continually with heavenly speech is holy.

Accustom your tongue to always speak about good people rather than the condemnation of wicked people. Make sure that all your good actions are done for God's sake. For you know that every such deed only brings you as much of a reward as you have done it out of fear and love for Him.
